

Rifle Postal League Rules

1. Eligibility to Shoot:
 1. All shooters must be matriculated students
2. Competition Format:
 1. All averages (individual/team) and location of shooting must be declared before the competition begins.
 2. The competition can be shot on Standard 10 Bull Targets OR on electronic targets.
 3. The cards must be shot, witness and dated by an approved official (Match Secretary or Captain)
 4. Cards must be shot BEFORE the Last Date of Final Shoot otherwise an extension must be applied for to the SSS chair.
 5. Cards will be marked before being shot with a sticker behind the first diagram of the card (Stickers will be provide to the teams to ensure there is no creating of own stickers)
 6. 2 points will be awarded for a win, 1 point for a draw and 0 points for a loss.
 7. If at the end of the season there is a tie, the tie breaker will be based upon Gun Score.
 8. Cards will be submitted at each GP, or by mail to the SSS chair or relevant marker
 9. Winners will be awarded with the other medals at the Awards Ceremony
3. League Format
 1. Each university will compete against the other universities, with an additional round shot against their declared average, creating 5 rounds in total
4. Substitutions
 1. When teams are submitted, a substitute can be submitted alongside the team with a personal average as well, to be approved by the SSS chair. In the event that a shooter cannot participate, the substitute can be used.
 2. There may only be one substitution per team per round
 3. If the substitute nor the original shooter is able to shoot, then an extension can be applied for from the SSS chair.
5. In Future Years
 1. For the first year of running, scores will not be handicapped and teams will not be divided based upon their class
 2. For the future: If there is more interest in this and multiple teams are submitted, there will be a division of teams in classes, with the same classes competing against one another. The classes will be based on shooters previous years SSS performance if possible, if not possible an average must be declared at the beginning of the season.
 3. If future competitions call for a handicap system, an agreement must be met between the SSS coordinator and captains of each university on what handicap system will be used.
