

Rifle Grand Prix

Rules and Regulations

Classifications: All individuals will be classed in either A, B, C, or Novice Class for this competition. These classifications are based upon performance in last years SSS competitions. New SSS shooters will need averages submitted for them. In order to qualify as a Novice, the individual cannot have been shooting for more than 6 months. School averages to be submitted where possible for new shooters.

Kit: the teams must provide all kit. Only legal ammunition is allowed, no homemade ammunition is allowed. A jacket, Glove, and Sling is required for taking part in this competition, those without will not be able to participate. All rifles must have serial numbers, any which do not will be reported to the police.

Eligibility: All shooters must be legally able to shoot, this information has been passed to all captains and any questions regarding it should be directed to the SSS Chair, or captains can check the Firearms section of the Police Scotland Website. If for any reason a captain feels that a shooter should not shoot then they can bring this to the SSS chair. All shooters must be matriculated students.

Challenges: Challenges of scores may be made at any time and will cost £1 from the university. A card may only be challenged once and the challenge is the final score. Scores CAN go down during challenging. Challenged must be done within 15 minutes of the last detail finishing.

Rules in a Draw If there is a draw between shooters or teams, then this will be solved by the count back rule. The count back rule being that, starting with the last diagram, the shooter who is the first to drop a point (not shoot a perfect 10) will be given the second position.

Medals: This competition is part of the Grand Prix series, which goes towards the overall team of 8 Trophy, as well as medals for the GP team of 8, Team of 4, Pair, Ladies Triad and Individual competitions.

Important Information: The captains will have access to the detail sheet via google docs and will be able to sign their shooters up in the correct slots, which will be 30 minutes, with 2 10 minute shooting times and a short break to change targets. All teams must be from SSS affiliated universities. All universities must have insurance, whether through NSRA, STS, etc. All Universities need to bring a copy of their FAC, including and personal FAC's for those shooters using their own firearms. If asked to produce and FAC and you are unable to, you will be disqualified.
