SCOTTISH STUDENT BOXING CHAMPIONSHIPS

24TH – 25TH MARCH 2018

HILLHEAD STUDENT VILLAGE HALL, ABERDEEN

The Scottish Student Boxing Championships returns! A series of Amateur Boxing bouts over the course of two days, with the finals occurring on the second day for each weight category. The Championships will be held on Saturday March 24th and Sunday March 25th at Hillhead Student Village Hall at the University of Aberdeen.

ELIGIBILITY:

- All boxers must be born on or before December 31st 1999 for insurance purposes. Boxers must provide ID to prove DOB at registration
- Entry into the SS Boxing Championships is restricted to Boxing Scotland registered boxers from 3rd level educational institutions which are affiliated to both SSS and Boxing Scotland. Novice boxers must have had 0-6 bouts, including Junior bouts. Intermediate boxers must have had a minimum of 7 bouts and a maximum of 14 bouts. Boxers with more than 15 bouts will compete in the Open category.
- Participants must also produce their University Registration card at the weigh in. NUS cards will not be accepted.

COST: £25 per boxer.

Please note that payment can be made via BACS or card online. Invoices can be requested through the Student Union. Boxers will not receive a refund if they do not get a bout.

ENTRIES:

- Unlimited entry per institution per weight category will be accepted.
- Boxers can only enter and compete in one weight category. However, boxers will be allowed to adjust the weight category in which they compete, by a degree of one either up or down, on the day of the Championships in accordance with their weight following the weigh-in.
- Contestants should be aware that this competition is run subject to receiving sufficient entries. If sufficient demand exists SS Boxing will offer an Open Championship to boxers who have 16 or more bouts experience club bouts at the time of the Boxing Championships.

WEIGH IN:

All entrants must weigh-in between 09.00am and 11.00am on Saturday 24th March 2018 & each day of competition that they are required to box thereafter. SCALES WILL CLOSE AT 11.00 EACH DAY.

BOUTS:

All bouts consist of 3 x 2 minute rounds, except 'Open-Class bouts, which will consist of 3 x 3 minutes. Seconds must dress in accordance with the AIBA Rules. 10 point MUST scoring system.

No headguards will be used during the Championships.

There is no guarantee that boxers will compete in the SS Boxing Championships. This is dependent on the amount of entries received. Announcements will be made each day of the Championships as to when the boxing will cease.

COACHES:

Coaches **must** be fully registered through the Boxing Scotland coach registration system and be in possession of their coach registration badge during the championships.

Female boxers should note that signed non-pregnancy declaration forms must be produced at the weigh-in.

MEDALS:

Gold and Silver medals will be awarded to the Winner and Runner up. A boxer must have won a bout in the competition in order to receive a medal.

DRAW:

The draw for the Championships will take place after scales close. Only boxers who have passed their medical* and have successfully gone through the scales will be entered into the draw. Tombola draw will be used if needed

WARNING:

SS Boxing reserves the right to withdraw competitors from this tournament.

*** Medical Procedure:**

- Boxers attend a medical
- Boxers send Boxing Scotland medical cards and registration forms
- Boxing Scotland return the medical cards with a blue registration book
- There is a maximum 14-day turnaround period for documents to be processed and returned by Boxing Scotland
- The blue registration book and medical cards **must be shown** at Registration at the event for boxers to compete
